Every exhibit must be the Bonafide property of the exhibitor and
Classes 3, 8, 9, 10, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19 must have been grown by exhibitor
Arrangements must contain flowers, fruit or vegetables. (no artificial)

SECTION CH

7 YEARS AND UNDER

Class

1. Decorated saucer arranged in wet sand (max 16cm diameter)
(Sand should be covered)
2. Novelty Exhibit – Made from fruit and/or vegetables
(Flowers allowed) Must be named
3. Miniature Garden – must be growing.
(Container not to exceed 1.3m perimeter)
4. A Mug of Flowers

10 YEARS AND UNDER

5. Arrangement in an unusual container
6. Bowl of floating flowers - max 20cm diameter.
(Flowers should cover water)
7. Novelty exhibit – Made from fruit and/or vegetables
(Flowers allowed) Must be named
8. Plant growing in pot or container
9. Miniature Garden – must be growing
(Container not to exceed 1.3m perimeter)
10. Terrarium

15 YEARS AND UNDER

11. Single flower arrangement
12. Arrangement Celebrating 125th Kalamunda Show
13. Novelty Exhibit – Made from Fruit and/or vegetables
(Flowers allowed) Must be named.

15. Cactus or Succulent, 1 pot
